























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- Provide local control of HMP implementation
- Comprehensive, coordinated, holistic basewide resource conservation
- Cooperative resource management as educational/economic reuse asset
- Provide Take Permits as may be required to implement Base Reuse Plan

Why HCP?



Take permits/local control of Endangered Species Act (State & Federal) compliance

- Provides Certainty & Assurances
 - Mitigation & funding established for 50 years
 - Take coverage for development & HMP activity
- Community
 - Streamlined, reliable, longterm permit process

- Environment
 - Coordinated ecosystem management
 - Adaptive management
- Flexibility
 - Amendment process
 - Management activities & funding
